
Read the story of Laban, Jacob, Leah and Rachel from Genesis 29-30.

- 1) Who truly loved Leah (see vs. 35)?
- 2) What elevates this fourth son of Leah and Jacob, Judah, above the other children? See Matthew 1:1-6.

**3) The name Judah means, “this time I will praise the Lord!” What had Leah learned about trying to earn the love of Jacob and the unconditional favor of God?**

**4) Consider the following passages. What do they tell us about the love of God in our lives?**
