MIDDLE SCHOOL FAMILIES:

This week, we will continue our 6-week focus on characters from God’s word. Some of them will be very familiar, others may be a bit less known. Read the story from the text given. Then, use discussion questions below to consider why this particular story was included in God’s word.

For the remaining 3-weeks of our character studies, we will look at people who did not get their name specifically mentioned in the Bible, but are part of God’s story of redemption.

Read the story of a young, but very sick—ok, she dies--little girl and a frail, very sick lady, both nameless, from Luke, chapter 8.

Discuss:

- 1) What was the same in both Jairus’ and the frail woman’s actions?**
- 2) The text does not say, but what might be some reasons Jesus did not want those who had witnessed the resurrection of the dead girl back to life, to tell others? Do a little research and see what you come up with . . . (compare Luke 8:38-39 with Luke 8:56).**
- 3) Why do you think these two healings are included in the gospel story?**
- 4) How do Jesus’ words: “Don’t be afraid, just believe” (Luke 8:50) apply to us? What are some things that cause us fear?**
